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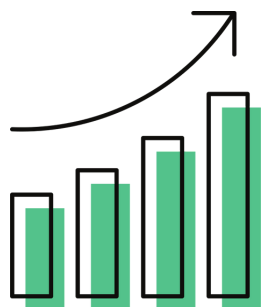
About the project

Financial decision-making skills will not only be introduced from an economic perspective, but also from social, environmental and good governance outlooks in an innovative approach to promote sustainability.

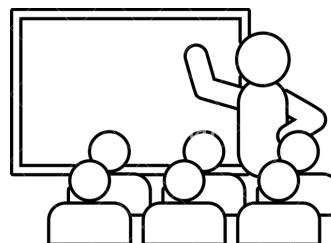


Project Results
